


Medical Informatics: A Proposed Fundamental Theorem

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Solutions developed and implemented: Case of Antenatal, Maternity EMR at Bwaila

- Background:
- Mortality rate: 675 per 100,000.
- •Infant mortality rate: 66 per 1,000
- •14 % HIV prevalence
- •Malawi has adopted option B+: Staring mothers on treatment as soon as they are found HIV+





Implications of Option B+

• Creates need of identifying and maintaining patients in care

• Needs integrated patient management since patients will access multiple services (ANC; ART programme)

Adherence to care guidelines



- •Users involved to define high level requirements


•Prototype developed and deployed: Incremental development.

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





Lessons learned

- •Need for representation from all sections within the health facility in order to have comprehensive user requirements.
- •Tightly coupling a solution to care processes presents an opportunity to improve patient care.
- Systems need to be introduced in the right precedence in order to avoid information overload.
- Value proposition needs to be identified at an early stage of EMR development.
